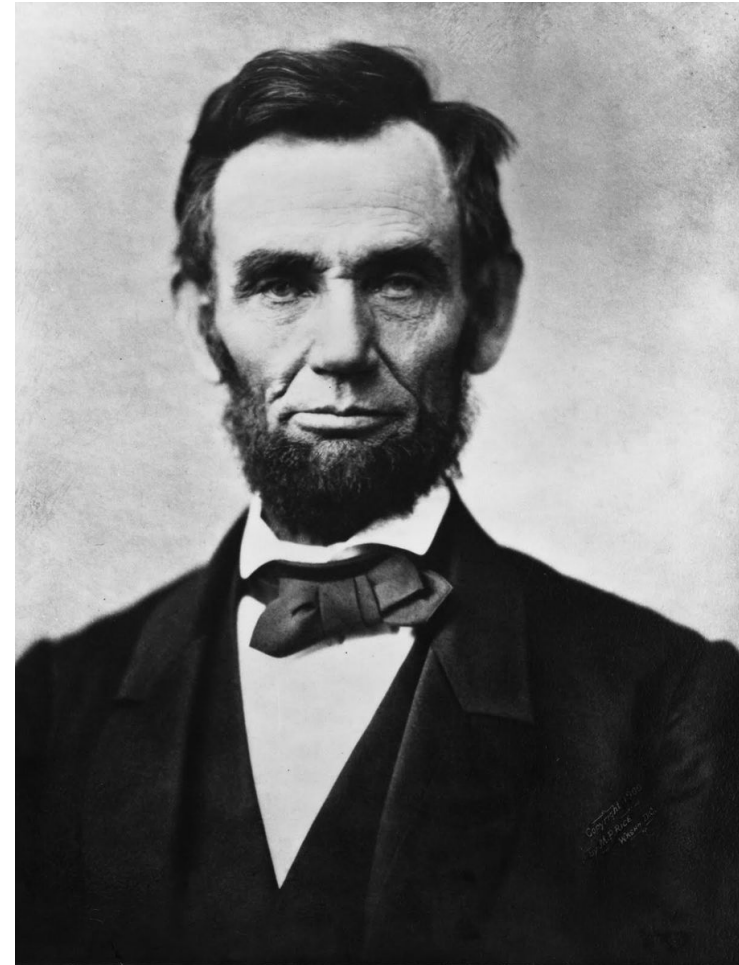

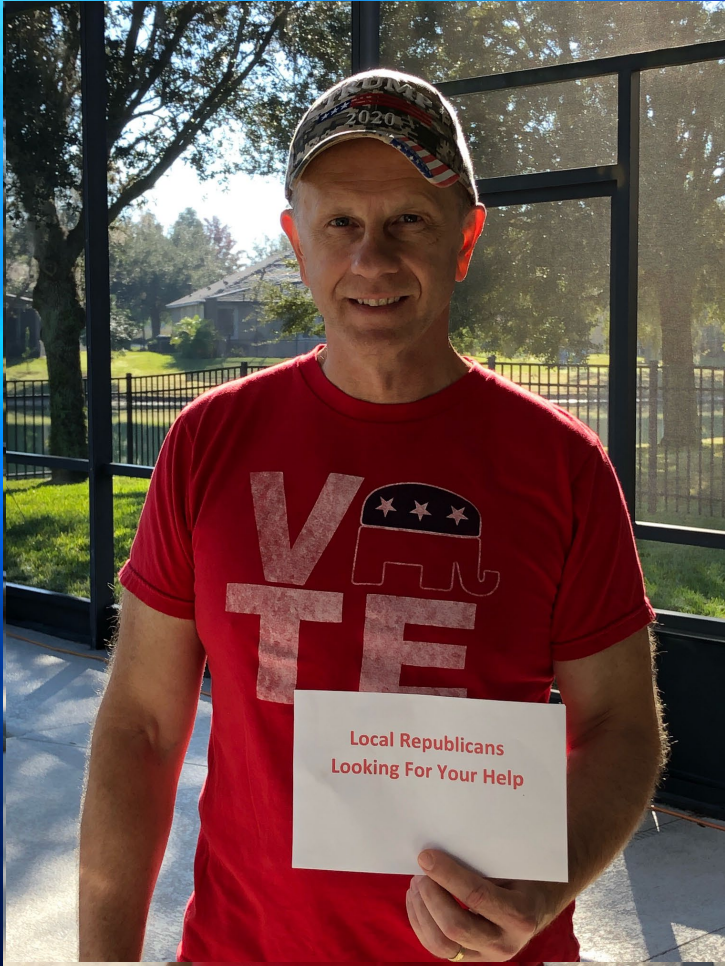

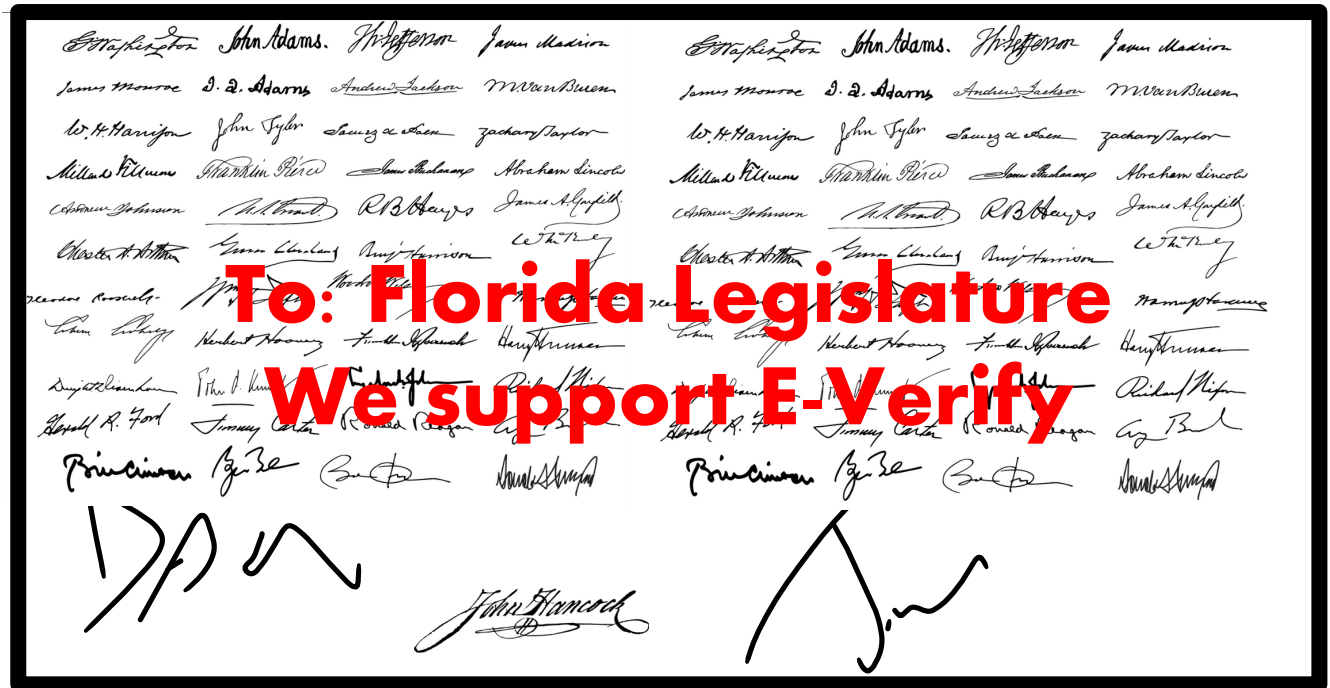
Banner Petition at Voter Registration Events

The Orange County Republican Executive Committee (OCREC) is a volunteer organization comprised of registered Republicans elected to represent, recruit and organize their County Precinct Republicans.

Each precinct is entitled to a Precinct Committeeman and Woman for every 1,000 registered voters, regardless of party registration.

Precinct 139 has over 7,700 registered voters.

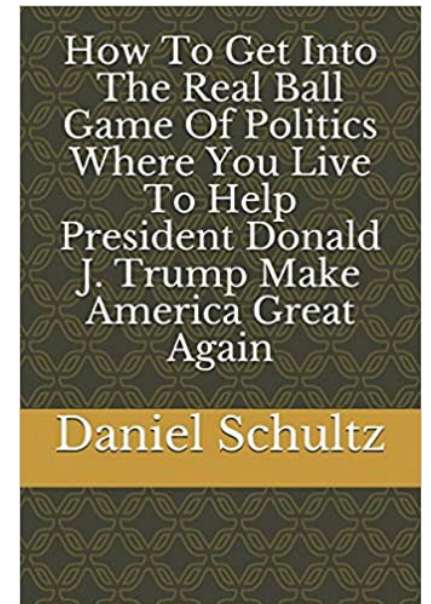

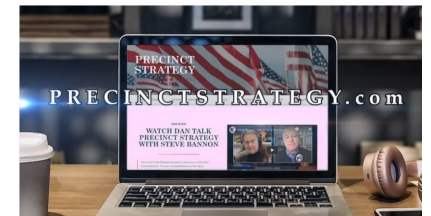
You will have to attend monthly meetings of the Orange County Republican Executive Committee. You must be registered to vote as a Republican.

Republican Party of Florida Party Rules of Procedure Republican State Executive Committee (RULE 5 – Election of Committeemen and Women A. (1)

RULE 5 - Election of Precinct Committeemen and Women

A. (1) Each precinct within each county shall, except as otherwise provided in this rule, the party constitution, or state law, elect one man, who is a registered Republican, and one woman, who is a registered Republican, to serve as Precinct Committeeman and Precinct Committeewoman. However, any precinct with a total registration equal to or greater than 1000 registered voters shall be entitled to an additional Precinct Committeeman and Precinct Committeewoman for every increment of 1000 registered voters in the precinct, who shall serve for the full term of the office regardless of change in precinct population.

(2) The number of registered voters shall be determined at or just prior to the commencement of the qualifying period for such office as shown by the most recent voter registration records of the Supervisor of Elections in such County. At any time thereafter, should the number of registered voters increase so as to exceed 1000 voters, the County Executive Committee shall elect one additional Precinct Committeeman and Precinct Committeewoman in accordance with the procedures set forth below for the filling of vacancies and who shall serve until the commencement of the term of his or her successor, if any.

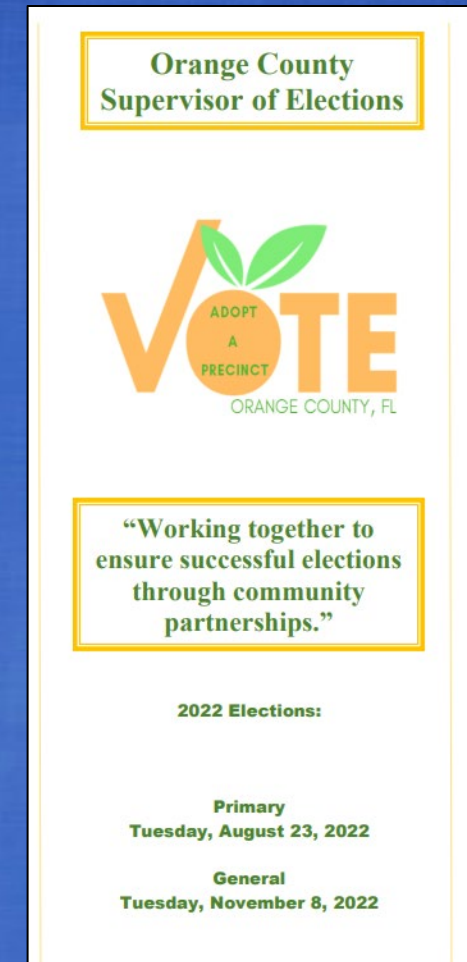

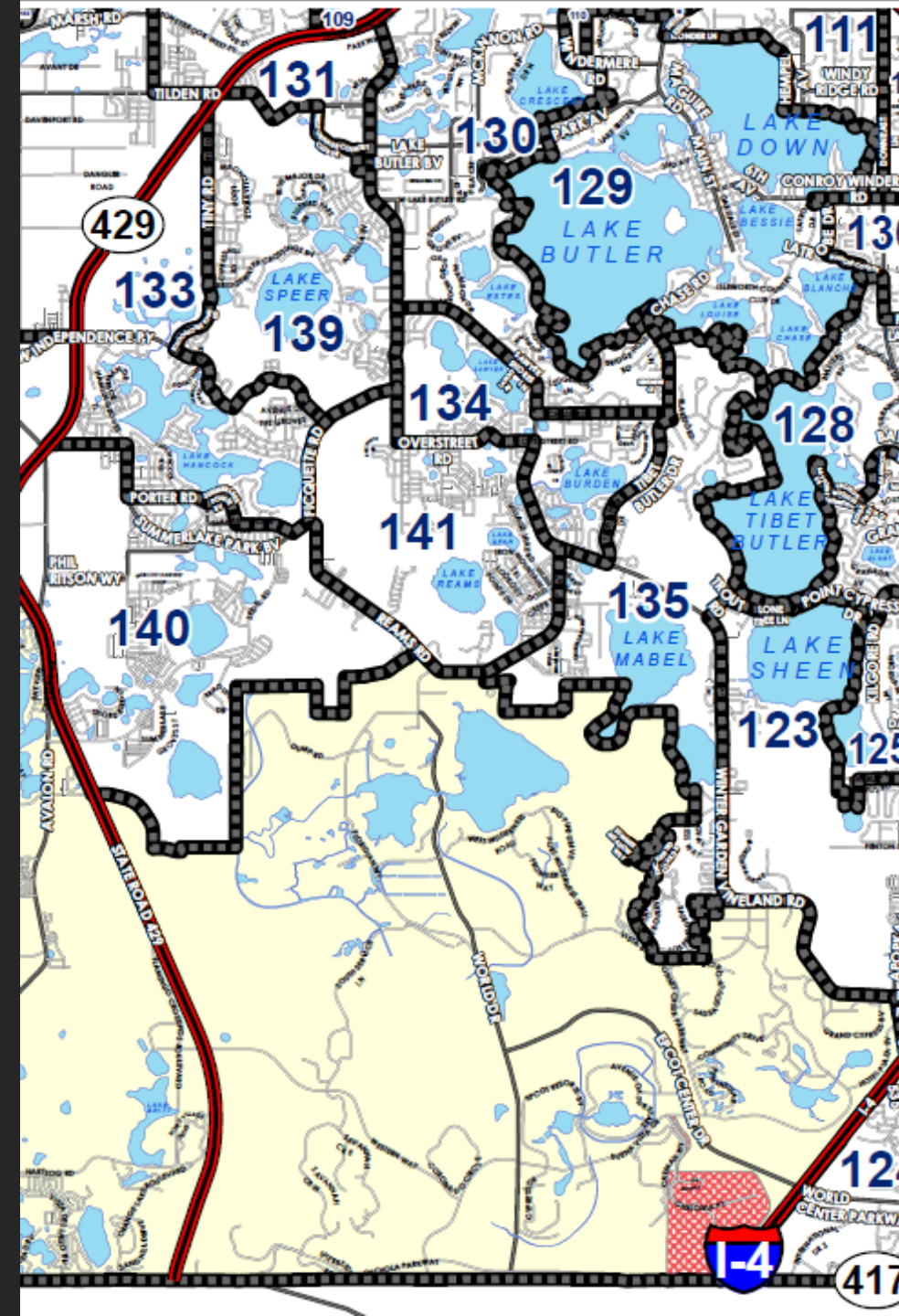

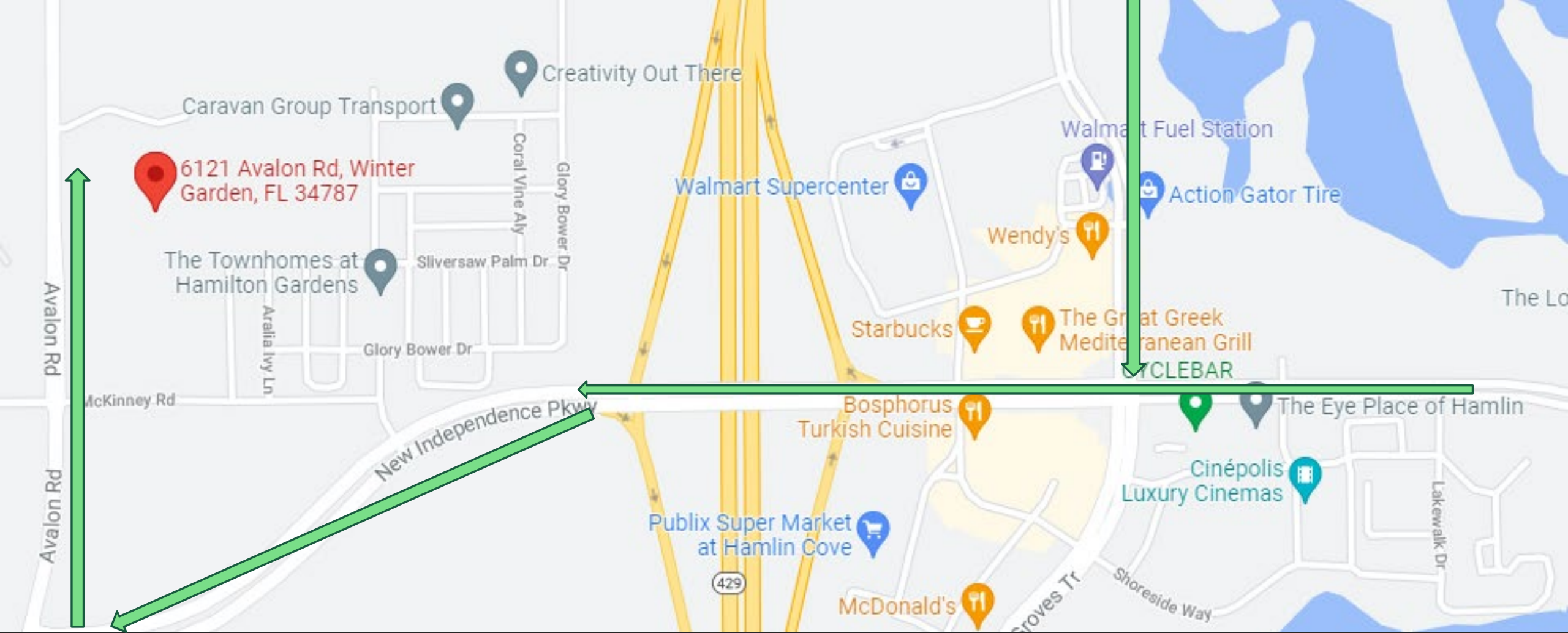

What are the requirements to be a poll worker?

- Be a registered voter in Orange County (except for the Help Desk Oath Person)
- Attend a mandatory training class before each election (minimum of 3 hours)
- Be available to work a minimum of 14 hours on Election Day
- Be willing to represent our office well in public
- Perform all duties for your position as assigned

This is a paid Nonpartisan job. Not to be confused with Poll Watcher.

Attending poll worker orientation does not guarantee you will work. Need is based on the number of workers needed and the miles you are willing to travel.

Share School Board Reporting

We have a multi-prong strategy for dealing with the School Board:

1. The School Board (purposely) makes it hard for parents to attend meetings. Most meetings are at 4PM on Tuesdays at their building in Orlando. Not the most convenient time and place for parents. Our precinct has a specific and measurable objective to have at least one speaker for the open session part of the meeting, and one email or phone call to be included in that part of the session. We want more than that.
2. We are working closely with other area groups. The West Orange Republican Women Federated (WORWF) has a permanent Education Committee. They do a great job of getting folks to attend School Board meetings. They also put out notes for each meeting, so you can keep up.
3. We are actively looking for candidates for the School Board. We have a plan for 2022 that in part is used as evidence to show candidates we will support them. Our precinct is in School Board District 4 (Pam Gould) and is not open until the 2024 election. The School Board Chair spot is open this year and we hope to support an America First candidate. By the way, School Board is listed as non-partisan, but is mostly run by socialists. Time to change that.

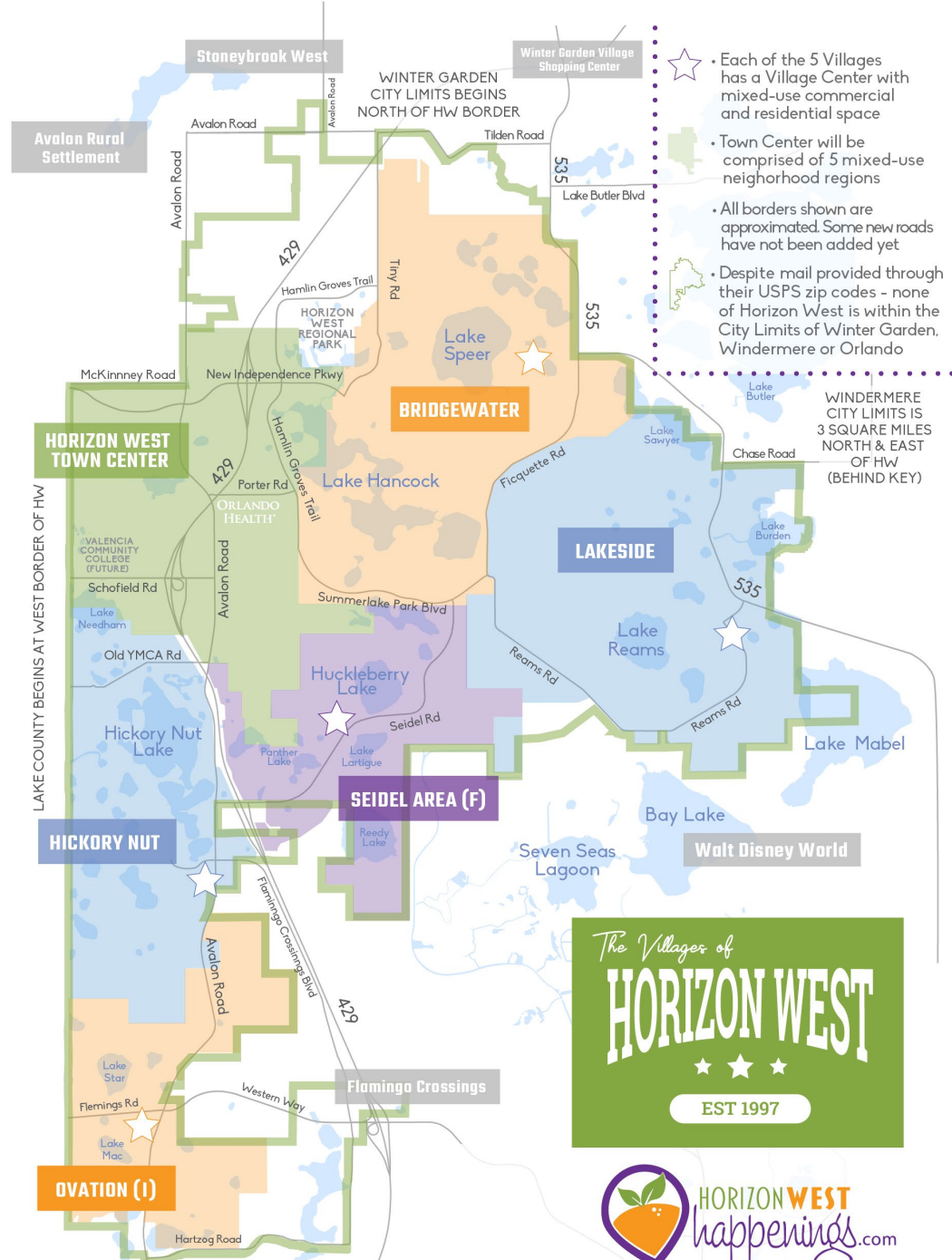
